Terry O'Brien from SOCAN will help demystify the business of music, with • A brief explanation and history of copyright as it relates to music creators • A rundown of what SOCAN is, and how performing rights organizations operate • An explanation of tariffs, licensing and royalties for music use in film/TV, radio, live performance, internet and other revenue streams • Information on music publishing and rights management • Coverage of new initiatives at SOCAN, including education, e-commerce, member benefits

Terry is the Education and Outreach Manager for the West Coast Division of SOCAN - the Society of Composers, Authors and Music Publishers of Canada. He is based in Vancouver. Terry has over 35 years' experience in various sectors of the music industry. Prior to joining SOCAN in 2000, Terry was VP and GM of BMG Music Publishing Canada Inc. He is also a composer, recording artist and performer of ambient soundscape music under the moniker Anomalous Disturbances.

Sat.Mar.5, 3-5pm | The Modern Musician: Creating in Every Environment and Growing in a Shrinking Industry with Russell Broom

Russell will talk about his career, where he started, what he does now, and where he sees the life of a modern musician going: from being an instrumentalist, to working in a few environments and keeping one's talent and ability relevant. Russell is a musician and engineer who has won WCMA awards, is a JUNO nominated producer, a JUNO winning songwriter, and AMPIA winning film composer. He is a Calgary-based "music guy" who is best known for his guitar/writing/production/engineering work with Jann Arden, including on her albums "Uncover Me", "Jann Arden", "Love Is The Only Soldier" and "Greatest Hurts". Other production credits include SheDaisy, The Dudes, Dojo Workhorse, Lindsay Ell, Chixdiggit, Michael Bernard Fitzgerald and more. He's also mixed #1 singles by Jann Arden, Brand New Sunset and Slot Machine. More recent credits include: Producing/Mixing Jason McCoy's Christmas at the Grand Special 2010. Bellestar (CMT), and mixing the Dakota Sessions for CMT — including: Sarah Harmer, Ron Sexsmith.Terri Clark and Doc Walker.

Paul has a Bachelor of Music Degree in classical percussion and trombone from the University of Lethbridge, and has been a professional educator and performer for 36 years. He has performed over 40 concerts with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, played for over 70 musical theatre productions, has instructed at over 350 clinics for band students on various instruments throughout Alberta, BC and Saskatchewan, and was a sessional music instructor at the University of Lethbridge 1982–2001 for studies in percussion, jazz ensemble, jazz history, rock history and education method courses. He is also an author, arranger and musical director, and performs professionally and teaches drum set, marimba, timpani, flute, clarinet, soprano-alto-tenor sax, trumpet, trombone, keyboards and electric bass.
